#### **HISTORY**

Surrounded by hills and mountains, rivers and rivulets, flora and fauna, Gokul-Parvati Rural College Kuntara was born in 1978 in a small private house called "KUTALI" so called a mill.

The Concept of dreaming of a college by that time in a remotest village like Kuntara stroke in the minds of the Intellectuals like this. A meeting was organised informally under a banyan tree in front of the old college building among all educationists, social workers and other elite mass of this locality. Late. Surendra Nath Sharma Retired I.A.S Officer of nearby village Jalibahal acted like an advisor. Besides him late. Minaketan Patel former Principal of Kuchinda College Kuchinda , Late. Prafulla Chandra Patel Kuntara, the founding father of the college, Late. Manohar Patel Kuntara, Late. Kamal Lochan Patel Kuntara, Late. Raghunath Meher former Head Master Manohar High School Kuntara, Late. Chudamani Patel Kusumi, Late. Somanath Patel Kuntara, Late Khadi Mahakul, Bomleikela, Late Lalit Mohan Naik, Dumbermal, Late Ratan Singh Patel, Rngiatikira, Sri Debadatta Panda, Sri Prahallad Acharya were present in the meeting. The other prominent villagers who were present to encourage the meeting were Late. Rasanand Patel , Sri Bhubaneswar Patel, late Sri Duryodhan Pandey and Sri Surendra Patel.

The great and praise worthy person who donated a sum of one lakh rupees as fixed deposit for opening of the college was Late. Gokuleswar Patel(H) Kantapali Jharsuguda after whom the college was named Gokul Parvati Rural College, Kuntara. Parvati being his consort.

Other some benevolent and land donors who donated land in the name of the college were Late. Dillip Nayak, Late. Chaitanya Nayak, Late. Hrushikesh Nayak of neighbouring village Pandaripathar. The College has 5.47 acres of land of its own. It is 22 km away from the sub-divisional head quarter Kuchinda and 60 km from the South-Eastern railway at Bamra station.

Now the new college building is situated amongst thick and green foliage at the outskirt of the village Kuntara by the side of the PWD road which runs from Paruavadi to Brahmanidihi, a length of 35 k.m., totally in a pastoral setting.

The college has been set up to cater to the educational needs of the masses especially poor people belonging to schedule Tribe and Schedule Castes. The college imparts education both in +2 Arts and Science and +3 Arts streams.

The college is affiliated to Sambalpur University, Jyoti Vihar Burla, Odisha.

It has a number of class rooms, staff and Students' common rooms, Laboratories, a separate principal's room, two +3 ladies' hostels one being funded by UGC and another one by ONGC and a big playground.

The college is proud of having qualified and well experienced teachers along with some young energetic teachers.

#### **GENERAL RULES OF THE COLLEGE**

- 1. An academic atmosphere must prevail in the college.
- 2. A student is usually admitted in to the college through e- admission process of SAMS.
- 3. A student must possess identity card having put on prescribed dress code.
- 4. In case of a missing identity card he/ she must apply to the office for the duplicate one.
- 5. No student can organise any political party or association in the college.
- 6. Chewing of Pan, Pan masala, Gutkha and spitting here and there as well as smoking is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Ragging in any form inside the college is strictly forbidden.
- 8. Every student must take care of the college property.
- 9. Any damage and destruction of college property must be punishable under law.
- 10. Any student indulged in any serious misconduct or activity will be expelled from the college.
- 11. Playing audio and video on mobile phone inside the college is strictly prohibited. Anyone found so, may be seized.
- 12. During leisure hour students are advised to sit inside the common room or classrooms and not to create any disturbance in the premises.
- 13. No one will be held responsible for any missing of any thing of the students.
- 14. No outsider is allowed to enter into the college without due permission of the principal.
- 15. Any other matter which is not under the said rule shall be referred to the principal whose decision is final and binding.

#### NSS

The National Service Scheme started from the session 1978-79. There is a boys' unit and girls' unit in +3 wing. The scope of NSS is very vast. Anyhow the main aims of NSS are described below.

- a. To project the potentiality of a student.
- b. To serve voluntarily for the society.
- c. To escalate leadership quality.
- d. To understand immediate problem of the surrounding and solve it.
- e. To sensitize people about different diseases like AIDs, Malaria, Pulse Polio, Dengue, etc.

#### **YOUTH RED CROSS**

The youth Red Cross (YRS) started in our college during the session 2004-05. All the bonafide student of the college are the members of it. The main aim of this Red Cross is to help people selflessly, at the time of need and emergency. Besides, it aims at rendering service at the time of natural calamity, help the poor and down trodden people, patients and the distressed ones.

The college has been organising blood donation camps, World AIDS Day and Health awareness programme from time to time. It was the proud moment of the college that the unit won an award at district level organised by the Sambad which is a Daily News paper.

Now the unit is being carried out by Mr. Shiv Shankar Mallick Lect. in Mathematics very promptly.

#### **ECO-CLUB**

This club started in our college during the session 2004-05, taking 40 students as its members in it. It was started under the guidance of Sri Khagapati Amat Lect. in History as Teacher in charge.

The basic objective of this club is to keep the college clean and greenery disposing garbage, planting seedling around the college and organising essay and debate competition among the students.

The club also grows kitchen garden inside the women's hostel and helps boarders providing green fresh vegetables for their mess. The girl boarders derive pleasure while walking in the garden and they also learn dignity of labour.

#### **WOMEN'S HOSTEL:**

There is a Women's hostel with 150 boarders as its intake capacity.

After admission in the college, a girl student can apply for a hostel seat in the prescribed form available in the hostel office during college admission. Students from far off places will be given more priority than the local students.

#### **Leave of Absence**

Boarders are advised to apply for leave of absence to the superintendent in writing. Leave will be granted to them in the presence of the parents / authorized guardians. Any boarder who over stays will be penalised as per the norms of the hostel. The assistant superintendent can grant leave of absence of a boarder in absence of superintendent.

#### Rules of the Hostel

- 1) The hostel gate is opened from 6 A.M to 6 P.M. The gate is locked up during night except urgent medical case. The night watcher is held responsible for any sort of deviation regarding closing and opening of the gate.
- 2) The office bearers are directly selected by the boarders to discharge different duties in presence of the superintendent.
- 3) Only authorized guardians are permitted to visit their wards in the presence of the matron. They can take their wards home with permission of the superintendent. No boarder is allowed to go home alone.
- 4) Study hour is to be maintained both in the morning and evening except in Saturday evening and Sunday morning. The time table of the study hour will be fixed up by the superintendent as per the change of season.
- 5) All cultural activities will be performed by the boarders in every Saturday evening in the presence of the superintendents. Likewise every Sunday morning will be spent for cleanliness of the hostel.
- 6) Study hour is maintained very strictly. No boarder is allowed to disturb others during study hour. The superintendent along with the matron can inspect the rooms from time to time to ensure the maintenance of the study hour.
- 7) All sorts of meetings will be organized by the boarders with due permission of the superintendent.

- 8) All boarders are responsible for cleanliness of their rooms and surrounding.
- 9) The hostel mess is managed by the boarders under the supervision of the superintendent. There are three to four boarder- auditors who audit and examine the accounts of the mess every month. The mess dues list will be displaced in hostel notice board being countersigned by the superintendent.
- 10) Every boarder must have to take 30 meals a month. It is compulsory.
- 11) Non-vegetarian food is served to the boarders from time to time according to their desire.
- 12)A boarder can stop and re-start the meal with proper intimation to the mess manager in writing. All the accounts in this matter will be done at the end of the month.
- 13)No boarder is allowed to use and keep mobile phone in the hostel. Every correspondence will be made through hostel office mobile phone.
- 14) No boarder is allowed to disfigure the walls or damage any property of the hostel. If found she will be penalised.
- 15) Any border violating any rule of the hostel will be exelled from the hostel within 24 hours.

#### STUDENTS' UNION & OTHER CULTURAL ASSOCIATIONS & SOCIETIES

#### SELECTION RULES FOR STUDENTS' UNION, OTHER SOCIETIES & ASSOCIATIONS:

The following guidelines will be strictly followed by the students during the period of election to different offices of students' union and other allied societies right from the date of notification to oath taking ceremony.

- i. There will be complete disassociation of student selection and student representation from political parties.
- ii. During the period of election no person, who is not a student on the rolls of the college, shall be permitted to take part in the election process in any capacity.

#### Eligibility Criteria for Candidates

- i. Undergraduate students between the age of 17and 22 and post graduate students with the maximum age limit of 24-25 years may contest for election.
- **ii.** The candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- **iii.** The candidate should have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer and two opportunities to contest for the post of any executive member.
- **iv.** The candidate should have attended the minimum percentage of 75% attendance in all subjects taken together.
- **v.** The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence for misdemeanour. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the university authority.
- **vi.** The candidate must be a regular, full time student of the college.

#### **Code of Conduct for Candidates and Election Administrators:**

- i. No candidate shall indulge in nor shall abet any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic or between any groups(s) of students.
- ii. Criticism of the other candidates, when made shall be confined to their policies and programme, past record and work. Candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspect of private life, not connected with the public activities of the other candidates. Criticism of other candidates or their supporters based on unverified allegations or distortion shall be avoided.
- iii. There shall be no appeal to caste or communal feelings for securing votes. Places of worship, within or without the campus shall not be use for election propaganda.
- iv. All candidates shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting all activities which are considered to be "corrupt practices and offences." Such as bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersanation of voters, canvassing or the use of propaganda within 100 meters of polling station, holding public meetings during the period of 24 hours ending with the hour fixed for the close of the poll and the transport and conveyance of voters to and from the polling station.
- v. No candidates shall be permitted to make use of printed posters, printed pamphlets or any other printed pamphlets or any other printed materials for the purpose of canvassing.
  Candidate may only utilize handmade poster which are procured within the expenditure limit set out herein above.
- vi. Candidates may only utilize handmade posters at certain places in the campus which shall be notified in advance by the election commission.
- vii. No candidate nor his / her supporters shall deface or cause any destruction to any property of the college. All candidates shall be held jointly and severely liable for any destruction/ defacing of any college property.

- viii. No candidates shall be permitted to carry out procession or public meetings or in any way canvass or distribute propaganda material outside the college campus.
  - ix. During the election period the candidates may hold procession and /or public meetings provided that such procession and /or public meeting do not in any manner, disturb the classes and other academic and co curricular activities of the college. Further, such procession / public meeting may not be held without the prior written permission of the college authority.
  - x. The use of loud speakers, vehicles and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited.
  - xi. On the day of polling, student organizations and candidates shall:
    - a) Co-operate with the officers on election duty to ensure peaceful and orderly polling and complete freedom to the voters to exercise their franchise without being subjected to any annoyance or obstruction
    - b) Not serve or distribute any eatables or other sold and liquid consumables, except water on polling day.
    - c) Not handout propaganda material on the polling day.
- xii. Excepting the voters no one without a valid pass/letters of authority from the election commission or from the college authority shall enter the polling booths.
- xiii. The election commission/ college authorities may appoint impartial observers. If the candidates have any specific complains or problems regarding the conduct of the election they may bring the same to the notice of the observers. Observers shall also be appointed to oversee the process of nomination of students.
- xiv. Contravention of any of the above recommendations may make the candidate liable to stripped of his candidature or his elected post, as the case may be. The election commission/college authority may also take appropriate disciplinary action against such a violator.
- xv. In addition to the above mentioned code of conduct certain provision of the Indian panel code 1860(selection 153-A and Chapter-IXAX "Offences relating to election") may also be applicable to students election.
- xvi. There will be a Grievances cell constituted by the principal including one girl student and one boy student from +3 year classes for redressal of grievances of the student during election process.
- xvii. Detailed election-rules shall be notified on the date of notification of the election.

#### **STUDENTS' UNION**

There is a students' union in the college where all the students of +3 classes are bonafide members. One president, one vice president, one secretary, one joint secretary, a lady representative and the class representatives come from each class are office bearers of the union for that academic year.

- 1. To create cultural and academic atmosphere

  - b) To prepare union budget
  - c) To implement the objective of the union

#### **FUNCTION:**

- 3. To organize Annual Athletic Meet every year

#### THE VICE-PRESIDENT:

The vice-president will maintains all accounts of the Association. He along with P.E.T will select the captains of all out door games.

#### P.E.T:

He will remain in charge of all sports materials. He will coach the athletes and instil a spirit of sportsmanship in the minds of the students.

#### **Self Defence Training Programme-**:

It is a training programme sponsored by the Govt. of Odisha for Girl students in each and every college. There is a unit in college which has been working since 2013-14. Now this programme is headed by Miss Deepika Behera Lect. in English from the session 2016-17. Total 300 Girls students have been enrolled in the programme. The training has been imparted to the students regularly in the morning in the college premises.

#### **WOMEN'S GRIEVANCE:**

There is an women's grievance cell in the college headed by a senior teacher and a lady teacher to inquire and suggest redressal to any grievance of any girl student or lady employee.

#### **ANTI-RAGGING CELL**

There is an anti-ragging cell in the college managed by some teachers. This cell is working according to the relevant decision of the honourable Supreme Court of India and orders of the UGC and Govt. Of Odisha. Students found involved in following activities will be punished severely.

- a) Teasing, harassing, commenting and humiliating.
- b) Assaulting or using criminal force.
- c) Causing physical hurt, kidnapping or death.
- d) Abetting suicide.

#### **LIBRARY RULES:**

The total stock of the library is 14100.

- 1. The library opens from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. on every working day.
- 2. Every bona fide student is issued with a library card at the time of admission. Books are issued to a student in production of library card for a period of seven days only at a time. If the return date of the book is on a holiday, it may be returned on the next day.
- 3. No book is taken out of the library without the knowledge of the librarian or without being entered in the register.
- 4. Any book lost, damaged or defaced by a borrower must be replaced by him or her with an amount three times of the price of the book.
- 5. Any book underlined, dog-eared or any page removed from a book will not be returned to the library. The borrower must have to replace a new book.
- 6. Magazines, journals, dictionary, Granthabalis and rare books are not issued to the students.
- 7. Spitting/ smoking inside the library is strictly forbidden.
- 8. The library premises must not be used for any purpose other than reading or consulting regarding books.
- 9. Books will be issued to the borrower as per the following way.
  - a) Member of teaching staff- 10
  - b) Member of non-teaching staff- 2
  - c) +3 Hons student -2
